5 Chairs Report

- We had our long-awaited Ofsted inspection however were not happy with the outcome so we submitted a complaint
- Ofsted have said they had incorporated our feedback into their redrafted report however they missed most of it out
- We now have now submitted a formal complaint re the quality of the inspection
- Q: What's the timeframe for this?

A: Ofsted have until 17 June to go through their complaint's procedure, carry out QA and then respond to the complaint. Depending on what they find depends on what happens next. If they do not uphold the complaint they will publish the report 5 days after their response Q: Is that likely?

A: There have been some complaints that have been upheld but the majority are not. They may return to inspect again which would mean another day in school within a fortnight of their response

- We had the budget setting meeting and it's not looking good
- We need more children to come to the school

6 Approval of Budget

Budget displayed on screen

 We are projecting to end this financial year with a deficit budget situation – (£15,504). In years 2 and 3 the deficit then becomes much higher

DG joined meeting at 17:21

- Governors introduced themselves to DG
- For the past few years we have had an in-year deficit however with the carry forward and careful management we have managed to keep our heads above water
- The deficit is largely driven by the fall in role, approx. 30 children leaving the school and only approx. 15 coming in each year
- We have reduced the number of classes according to the smaller intakes however do not wish to reduce the PAN permanently as this is then very difficult to reverse
- The Resources committee met on Thursday and recommend this budget for approval
- We are in a similar position to a lot of other South Glos schools who are in a deficit position
- Q: What are the ramifications of a deficit budget?
- A: It seems there aren't really any at the moment. We tried earlier in the year to contact the head of finance at the LA, however did not receive a reply
- The LA don't seem to want to support us through the dip in numbers although they would provide financial support if we reduce our PAN
- Q: The change in local area (potential new houses), if that becomes firm, would that change?

A: It should do, but that would not be until planning permission is granted. The initial draft strategic plan issued by the LA mentioned additional houses between The Wave and the school

Q: What about the new houses at Cribbs Causeway?



A: They hopefully should start to yield some children in the near future
however there are plans for new schools in that development

Q: Have we thought about a leaflet drop?

A: We have leaflets in pre-schools and in the show homes at Cribbs and banners in the local area

Q: What about Estate agents?

A: We have issued leaflets to the local agents who sell houses in the area. We will top up the leaflet supplies to all of these places in the summer

 We do know that this year is a low birth rate in the whole area and the projections for pupil numbers do increase slightly for future years

There is new funding available from the government which we will apply for to enable us to extend after school care until 6pm Mon-Thur and open on Fri, we will approach an external provider to run the Friday
- Q: Are you limited on who can staff it? Could it be anyone who has a DBS check.? Could it be staffed by volunteers?
- A: The staff need to have certain training it couldn't be solely run by volunteers
- The previous ASC used to be run as a charity and caused the school quite a number of issues. It has been much better since being taken into the school's management

8	 Headteacher's Report (including attainment & progress data and SDP review) Documents circulated in advance of meeting Attainment and progress information was reviewed at the Q of E committee meeting. We can see that children are making positive progress across year groups and subjects and we can see we are where we should be. There are more children who are secure and less in emerging categories as the year goes on Y6 have sat their first SATS tests today, they have done their SPAG and spelling and seemed to take in stride this morning. The test papers are bagged up and ready to be collected tomorrow. It's the Reading test tomorrow then Maths on Wednesday and Thursday 	
	Q: Have you managed to see the paper from today? A: Yes, PS saw it as was supporting a child at ALM, it was ok. There were a lot of questions about word classes in the SPAG test, relative clauses, adverbials etc. It was what we would expect Q: As year 2 tests are now non-statutory, do we still get papers sent? A: Yes, we do. We are doing them w/c 17 June they will be used for our internal verification. They are now non-statutory however the DfE have identified certain schools which must do them. National poll shows 70% of schools are doing them, 30% not Q: Would any parents see that as a positive that we are continuing to do the tests i.e. could it be a selling point or are they not that bothered?	
	 A: Most are not that bothered Targets are unchanged, we are constantly checking in terms of planning and scrutiny Lesson visits are a focus – we are seeing consistency from last terms visits 	
	 Pupil conferencing data from Science is positive EYFS planning is shared with ALM and adapted to meet needs of children here 	
	 ELG - last year national average was 72%, we are on track to exceed this, writing is the area for development where there are a number of children just on the cusp of writing, we have some who are already writing sentences Q: What's the percentage per child? A: 5.5% 	
	 Phonics is really strong. We are on track for 89% or higher to pass the test, national average last year was 78%. Government target is to achieve 95% 	
	Q: Is that something that can be highlighted to parents?	
	 A: Yes, we do talk about this to parents Megan Bell has been identified by the English hub as an example of excellent practise

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recommendation of our School Improvement Adviser as a school to come and see Phonics and Maths teaching as it is strong

Q: Does that not make a bearing on the Ofsted judgement?

A: No unfortunately not

- Curriculum this will be reviewed at the inset day in June where it will be reviewed and adapted
- Pupil premium attendance there is quite a large percentage of persistent absence largely due to holidays. These children are supported in class
- Sports provision we have decided to remain with Bristol Sport as our provider for next year
- SEND a Y6 child has been awarded with an EHCP from April with funding from June, this will be used to support transition to secondary. The Y1 child with an EHCP's annual review took place last week
- Q: Is the Y1 child staying with us next year?
- A: Yes, they are staying for next year
- Attendance just at national average, so the success of last year where we were above national last year has been lost. We are lower than national average for persistent absence. Any child with below 85% we have EWO (Education Welcome Officer) involvement. The child who has the lowest attendance is in Reception. We cannot take parents to task until one term after a child's 5th birthday. We will be having a SAM meeting with the family this term however. A lot of children have had extended holiday periods and these are ongoing, there have also been a few hospitalisations (not school related)
- 2 new children started today
- Safeguarding RM & PS are going to complete the safeguarding audit following this meeting, we have very effective safeguarding in place
- 1 child has social care involvement
- Spirituality week took place this features heavily in SIAMS
- Bridge FOS character education is continuing with a Y2 event last week and Y4 one planned for next week
- H&S covered at Resources committee
- Bridge FOS work is going well. We've been working with Severn Federation Academy Trust on a shared SEND strategy. Had steering group meeting last week, proposals were made for strategic lead role to continue, the costs for this are included in the budget

	mental wellbeing is a concern. There is a concerns line to call during the inspection and up to 24 hours following inspection	
	Ofsted are bound by the DfE who are remaining steadfast that	
	nothing will change regarding the inspection regime and single word	
	judgements, recommendations seem to have fallen on deaf ears.	
	There are further changes to come in September – there will be no	
	deep dives, there will now be extended learning visits to classrooms	
	which are likely to be very similar	
	Q: If we'd had a full inspection, do we think the outcome would have	
	been different?	
	A: It's difficult to say but that is the indication that was given	
	Q: Is there different timing for full inspections and ungraded ones?	
	A: The cycle of inspections is every school should be inspected every 4	
	years. Most schools inspected this year have been coming up to 6 years	
	since their last inspection due to delays arising from Covid but it should	
	be return to every 4-5 years shortly. We should expect a graded	
	inspection in the next 12-18 months	
	Q: Is there anything we should be doing as governors to support staff?	
	A: Continue to support staff and encourage them	



	Q: Will next year's SIAMS inspection be another thing for staff to worry about? A: It should be nothing to worry about, it's about the ethos of the school. We will prepare for it of course. They will talk to children about impact of collective worship and watch an RE lesson
